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RF Safety Information

The handset has an internal antenna located at the top of the phone. For optimum performance with minimum power consumption do not cover the antenna area with your hand. Hold the handset between thumb and finger in the middle of the device. Covering the antenna affects call quality, may cause the handset to operate at higher power level than needed, and may shorten talk and idle times.

Radio Frequency Energy

The handset is a low-power radio transmitter and receiver. When switched on it intermittently transmits radio frequency (RF) energy (radio waves). The transmit power level is optimized for best performance and automatically reduces when there is good quality reception. Maximum power is only used at the edge of network coverage so under most circumstances the power output is very low. Under poor network conditions the phone transmits at a higher power, may get hot and have a significantly shorter battery life.

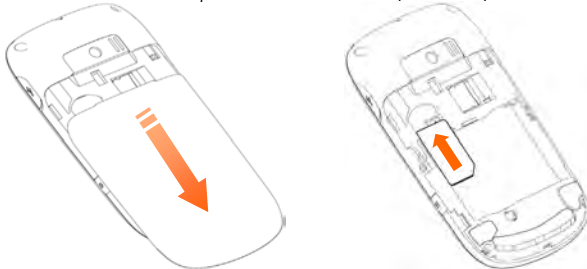

1 Getting Started

1.1 Insert the (U)SIM Card

The **(U)SIM card** (UMTS Subscriber Interface Module) is the small plastic smart-card with gold contacts. It holds account and contact information and can be used to store text messages. It can be moved between different phones if required.

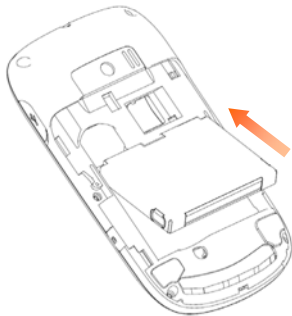
- The (U)SIM card **must** be inserted before use.
- Insert the (U)SIM card with the **gold contacts** facing **down** and the bevelled edge on the bottom left as shown. Carefully slide it into the housing observing the correct orientation.



If your handset displays:	
Enter Handset unlock code	The default code is 0000
Enter (U)SIM PIN Code	Enter the PIN supplied with your (U)SIM card
No (U)SIM detected	Check the (U)SIM is inserted correctly.
Enter PUK code	Contact your Service Provider

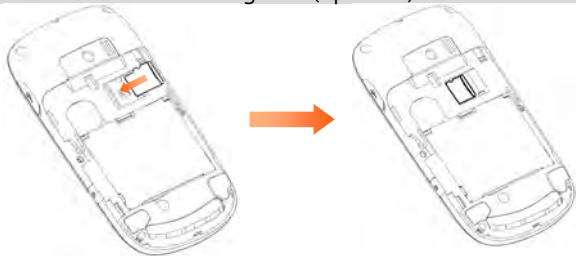
1.2 Insert the battery

1. Insert the battery as shown with the contacts located against the gold springs.
2. Press the battery down flush into the case.




3. Line the battery cover up correctly and press gently to close the case.

1.3 Insert a microSD™ memory card (optional)



1.4 Switch the phone On or Off

Press and hold the red key  for **two seconds** to switch the phone **ON** or **OFF**.

Enter (U)SIM PIN code – supplied with your (U)SIM card.

1.5 How to Lock / unlock the screen


Unlock / Lock the screen: Slide the key into the lock to unlock. Hold the Space key to lock.

Auto keylock: Menu > Settings > Screen > Keylock

1.6 How to set the time and date

The time and date is set automatically from the network. It takes a few seconds to update when the phone is first switched on. Select **12** or **24 hr** format in the **Network Time** menu. To manually set the time it is necessary to switch **Network Time off:** Menu > Settings > Phone > Time and Date > Automatic Time Update - Off then set the time and date manually.

1.7 How to connect the charger



- Only use the AC charger and USB lead supplied. Insert the charger lead **carefully**.
- Check the plug and socket are aligned correctly.
- Do NOT use excessive force which may damage the USB port.
- Be careful to avoid tripping or pulling on the lead whilst it is plugged in.
- Physical damage to the USB port is NOT covered by warranty.
- The phone can also be charged by connecting it to a computer using the USB lead supplied.
- A sound is played when the charger or USB cable is plugged in.
- The phone can be charged in the ON or OFF state: When switched OFF “Charging” is displayed. When switched ON the battery icon animates until fully charged.
- If the phone is off after charging long press the red key  to switch it on.
- Avoid high temperatures and direct sunlight. The battery will not charge when over 45°C





1.8 Tips to maximize battery life

- Do not leave the battery in a discharged state. Charge the battery promptly when flat.
- Keep your handset and battery cool. High temperatures degrade the battery more quickly.
- **Normal charge time is 3-4 hours.** Do not leave on charge for more than 24hrs.
- After 2-3 charge / discharge cycles the battery life will improve. From then on use top up charging to recharge frequently and always charge promptly when flat.
- When not using the phone for long periods charge to approx 40% and remove the battery.
- With **poor network conditions** (less than 2 bars) **battery life is reduced.**
- Turn off Bluetooth when not in use and limit multimedia functions to extend battery life.

1.9 How to make a voice call

- Enter the number on the keypad and press the green  key to make the call.
- Press **Speaker** on the screen to activate Handsfree mode
- Press the red key  to end the call.



1.10 How to answer an incoming call

- Press the green key  to answer the call. Press **Speaker** for Handsfree mode.
- Press the red key  or **Reject** to end the call.



If **Voicemail** is active pressing **Reject** forwards the call to **Voicemail**.



1.11 How to send a Text Message (SMS)

- Press the Messaging icon  for **Messages**
- Press **OK** for **New message**.
- Enter the phone number directly or press **OK** to select from **Contacts** or **Recent Calls**
- Select the **Contact(s)** using the checkbox on the right, & press **Done**.
- Press the **Down Arrow**  **once** to move the cursor into the text field
- Type the message using the letter keys on the keypad
- Press **Send** to send the message.

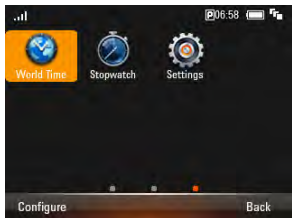
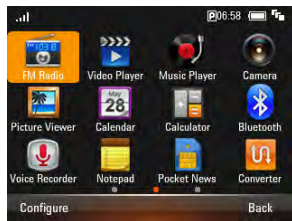
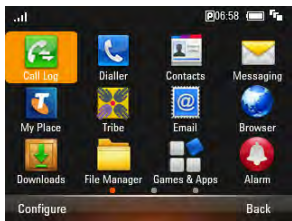

2 Contacts

There are some numbers that you may want to call again and again so it makes sense to add these to your Contacts. You can then access these numbers quickly and easily and add special features such as Speed Dialling a dedicated Ringtone and Photo.

Contacts stored on the (U)SIM card are limited to 2 or 3 numbers and 1 Email address depending on the type of (U)SIM card used.


3 Messages and Emails

3.1 How to send a Text Message (SMS) or Multimedia Message (MMS)

Press the messages icon  > New Message or **Menu** > **Messaging** > **New message**.

- Press the **OK Key** to **Add** a number from **Contacts** or **Recent Calls**.
- Press the right arrow to move into the number entry field to enter the number manually.
- Press the **Down Arrow** to move into the text field.
- The **default text mode** is **Abc** indicated by **Abc** in the top left corner of the display.
- Type your message using the QWERTY keypad. Press backspace  to delete characters.
- Press the  **key** to select text modes **En (Predictive text)**, **ABC, 123** or **Abc**.
- Press **Alt** to select the red symbols on the keys. Press **Sym** to access more symbols.
- The handset remembers your last setting.
- When completed press **Send**.
- Sent messages will be saved in the Sent box.
- If the message fails to send it is saved in the Outbox.
- If you exit without sending you can save the message to Drafts.
- Press **Options** > **Insert File** or **Insert Media** to add a picture or audio file to send as an MMS.

3.2 How to view a received Text Message (SMS)

- The **envelope icon**  on the **information bar** indicates a new SMS message. The **message alert tone** and **vibrate** activate depending on the current **profile** setting. Press **OK** to view.
- The envelope icon will clear once all unread messages have been viewed.
- Navigate to the Inbox (**Messages** > **Phone Inbox** > **OK**) to view received messages. Scroll to the desired message and press **OK** to **View**.

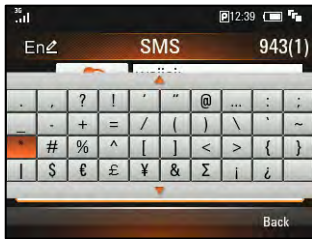
3.3 How to receive a Multimedia Message (MMS)

Press  for **Messaging > Phone Inbox**

- When **receiving** an **MMS** you get a standard **message alert**. Press **OK** to **View**
- The attachment is automatically downloaded with the message
- Touch the attachment on screen to save a copy to your handset.

3.4 Special Characters and SMS Message Length

Press **Alt** to select the red characters on the screen. Press **Sym** to access more special characters.

SMS length	If your text message exceeds 160 characters or 70 Unicode characters then you will get charged for multiple SMS messages.

3.5 WAP Push Messages

 **Messaging > Settings > MMS Settings > Receive PUSH Message.**

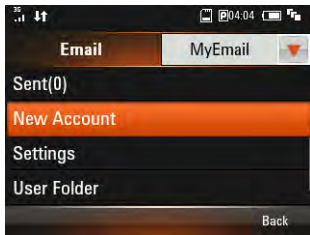
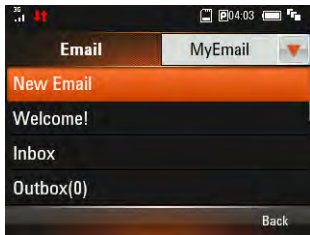
A WAP push message is a formatted SMS that displays a message to the user, giving the option of connecting directly to a website using the browser.

- WAP Push Messages are indicated by the  icon on the main display.
- Use the Browser to view Push Messages. Switch to Off to disable Push Messages.

3.6 Set up your Email

The **default** Email **client** is configured for Telstra. Go to Welcome! to subscribe to this service. If you do not subscribe to the Telstra My Email service then select New Account to configure your own Email service. See 'How to set up a new Email account' for more details.

- Press the **down arrow ▼** to enter the Text Field
- Press the **down arrow ▼** to add attachments
- When you are finished press **Send**.

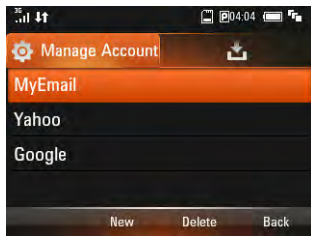

5.1 Using the Camera and Video Camera

Select **Menu** > **Camera**. Tap the screen to select between **Camera** and **Video** mode.

5.2 Join Me PC and MAC Connection Suite


Join Me is used to connect your phone to a computer. Once installed Join Me is used to manage contacts, messages and calendar functions. It is also used to connect to the internet and transfer music / picture files.

- Please connect your handset to your computer using the USB lead supplied.
- Browse to the CDROM drive and double click 'Autorun.exe' 
- The software is **only** compatible with Windows 7, Vista, XP and MAC OS (10.5,10.6) and above.
- The software may not run in all environments, or in conjunction with other software
- Multi-boot systems are not supported
- The software should be installed and run with the Administrator login
- Please read the Join Me Help file from within the application, or see our web site FAQ's at <http://www.zte.com.au> for more support.
- Multiple day repeated events are not supported by the handset or by Join Me.
- A maximum of 500 calendar events are supported on the handset and Join Me.
- Calendar functions can only be synchronised in day view or list view mode.
- Contacts stored on your computer can be imported using the import from Outlook function.

6 Troubleshooting, Technical and Warranty Information

6.1 Troubleshooting and FAQ's

Please check the manual thoroughly before contacting your service provider.

Symptom	Solution
No incoming ring or alarm tone	Check the ring tone and ring volume settings under Profiles. Check the handset is not muted (press the Volume Up key)
(No) keytones when pressing keys	Check the key tone settings in the current profile. Menu > Settings > Profiles > Edit > Keytones
How do I extend the incoming ring time?	This is not a handset setting. Please contact your Service Provider to extend the ringing time.
How do I change the Ringtone?	Menu > Settings > Profiles > Edit the current profile and select a new tune from the Audios directory.
A phone number cannot be dialled	Check for network coverage. Check your account is active. Check whether any call restrictions are set. Menu > Settings > Call > Call Barring.
MMS messages cannot be sent or received	Your subscription does not include data services. Check with your service provider.
How do I change to Predictive Text?	Press the  key to toggle between different text modes. The handset remembers your last setting.

Symptom	Resolution
I cannot connect to Join Me	<p>Check: Menu > Settings > Connect > PC Connection > USB See the Join Me User Guide within Join Me Uninstall and re-install the software. See FAQ's at http://www.zte.com.au/ for more assistance.</p>
My phone is slow to respond, handset storage problems	<p>Power cycle your phone to refresh the memory. Delete old SMS messages and other content. Restore default settings: Menu > Settings > Phone > Restore Default Settings > 0000</p>
The battery discharges quickly	<p>Possible network coverage issue. Check the signal level. With only 1 or 2 bars, the battery has to work harder to maintain network contact. Limit multi-media and Bluetooth usage to save power. The battery may be worn out.</p>
I cannot charge the phone	<p>Confirm the charger is properly inserted. Remove the battery, clean the contacts and check it is inserted correctly. The battery may be worn out. Tip: Charge the phone using the supplied USB cable.</p>
How do I write an SMS?	<p>Menu > Messages > New message From the phone number field press the down arrow to move into the text area. Use predictive text or abc mode to type words using the keypad.</p>
The handset switches on automatically	<p>An alarm or calendar event switches the handset on automatically.</p>

Symptom	Resolution
The handset switches off after charging	The handset is charging in the off state. Press and hold the Red key to switch the handset ON.
My phone is not able to connect to other Bluetooth devices	Menu > Bluetooth > On, Visibility > On. Possible compatibility issues. Manufacturers incorporate different Bluetooth profiles. Not all functionality is supported.
The screen calibration is not accurate	Go to Menu > Settings > Screen > Touch Screen Calibration to recalibrate the touch screen.

No (U)SIM detected	Check a valid (U)SIM card is inserted See Getting Started
Enter PIN code	Enter the correct PIN code supplied by your service provider
Enter PUK code	Contact your service provider to get the PUK code
Enter handset lock code	The default handset lock code is 0000
File does not exist or is in the wrong format	Check the file type is supported by the handset. On your PC or MAC, make sure the file is closed. Re-send the file using Join Me or Bluetooth transfer.
